Znanje brez meja (marec–december 2018)

Razstava prikazuje štirinajst uspešnih inovatorjev in znanstvenikov, ki so zaradi iskanja, razširjanja in soustvarjanja znanja odšli iz naših krajev v širni svet oziroma jih je pot zanesla k nam. S pomočjo njihovih zgodb, podkrepljenih z bogatim gradivom, želimo izpostaviti pogosto spregledan pozitiven vpliv migracij na našo družbo.

V sodelovanju z Uradom Evropske unije za intelektualno lastnino bomo mlade na podlagi aktualnih razstav in primerov iz vsakdanjega življenja osveščali o pomenu intelektualne lastnine, njene zaščite in jih soočili s posledicami njene zlorabe.

Martin Sever, oče prvega slovenskega kombija (maj–december 2018)

Inženir Martin Sever je bil avtor prvega serijskega kombiniranega vozila v Sloveniji in prvih IMV-jevih prikolic, kakršne so izdelovali v Novem mestu. Ob teh, marsikomu še dobro znanih izdelkih, se je Martin Sever ukvarjal še z marsičem zanimivim s področja tehnike, kar bo predstavljeno na razstavi.

Temporary Exhibitions:

Knowledge without frontiers (March–December 2018)

This exhibition presents fourteen successful individuals across different fields of science and technology who migrated to or from Slovenian territory in search of knowledge and innovation. Through their stories, supported by rich interpretive material, we seek to highlight the positive impact of migration on our society.

In Case You Did Not Know (March 2018–March 2019)

Based around the existing museum collections and using examples from everyday life we will, with the support of the European Union Intellectual Property Office, raise awareness specifically for the younger generation on the significance of intellectual property and its protection whilst also confronting them with the consequences of piracy and counterfeiting.

Martin Sever, Father of the First Slovenian Van (May–December 2018)

Martin Sever was the designer of the first mass-produced van in Slovenia and also responsible for the the first IMV caravans, produced in Novo mesto. In addition to other familiar products, Martin Sever was interested in many fascinating topics from the field of engineering which will be presented in the exhibition.

What's new:

- Collection of Albin Novak's models of airplanes by Slovenian aircraft designers
- New display of collection of protocol vehicles, most associated with Yugoslav President Tito
- Exhibition of textile industry development in Slovenian territory
- Exhibition about the history of Bistra

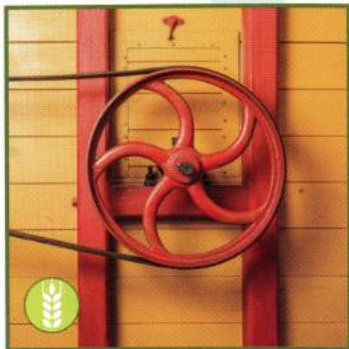

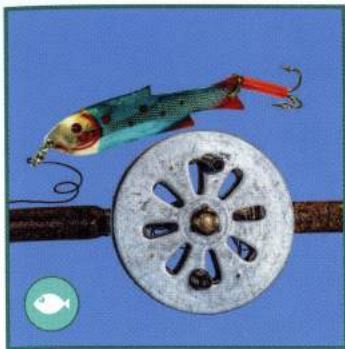

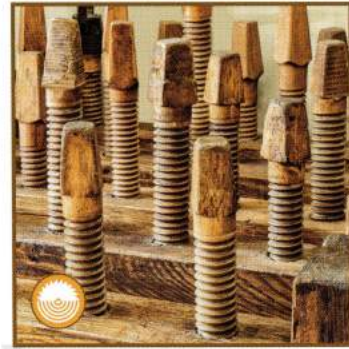
